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Challenge Statement

“Star House is planning to expand their presence to other cities to target the most in need populations such as homeless youth and have partnered with us to leverage data and analytics to find the right areas for their expansion.”

*The Question: Where should Star House
expand to target in need populations of
homeless youth?*

The Answer: Athens

- **Athens** is our prime choice because:
 - Proximity to **Hocking, Vinton, and Gallia**, analyzed to be three of the counties with the **highest disproportion of homeless youth** compared to the youth population in Ohio.
 - Proximity to **Meigs and Hocking**, the counties that are among the **highest average annual increase** in sale price of houses
 - Expansion within state will provide **ease** in developing a new Star House location at a **faster rate**
 - **Accessible** to nearby counties through public transportation

Our Approach

- From all the data, we mainly used Housing inventory count by CoC , Point in time by CoC, growth annual income per county, yearly house prices, and geographic mapping
- Determined these key areas of interests because:
 - Helps determine youth homelessness needs
 - More susceptible to displacement from household due to rising house prices
- Ohio-centric approach
 - Proximity to **Columbus** improves services
 - Potential for increase in local government funding

Metric 1 - Homeless Youth by Total Population Ohio

- Important predictor used to build a center where youth homelessness rate is high
- **Vinton** and **Hocking** were among the top counties for homelessness rate

Youth Homelessness rate = Youths Homeless / Total Youths in county

- Counties with the lowest Income Earners (< \$25K) in Ohio, adjusting by gross income and the lowest earners per county, sorted in descending order
- **Washington County** ranks at the top on low income earner

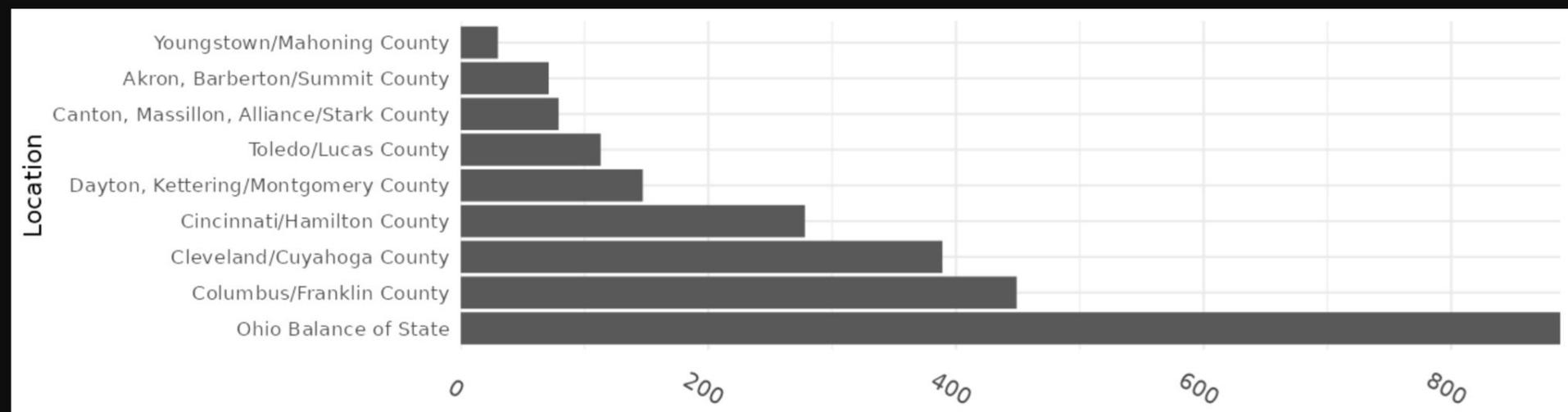

Housing inventory count by CoC - 2021, Point in time by CoC - 2021

- Compares the available youth beds found in the housing inventory by the point in time count of the number of youth homeless
- From this we can conclude that most counties in Ohio are lacking sufficient beds for their youth homeless population

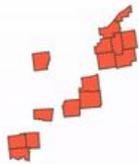

Annual Increase in House Price Index For a Single Family Home Compared to the Year Prior to, 1986 to 2021



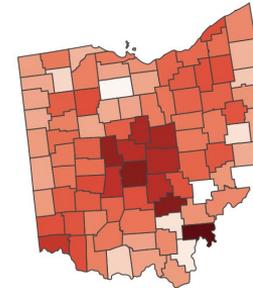

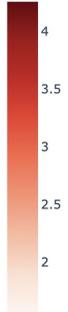

Recommendation: Why we picked Athens as the County

- Multiple Other Nearby Areas with high youth homelessness rate
 - Vinton, Hocking, Gallia, Washington, Meigs
- Has a large substance abuse rate
 - ~1/3 homeless have alcohol and/or drug problems
 - ~20% have lifetime histories of drug
 - Potential cause of adolescent youth homelessness
- Easy Access to Public Transit in Surrounding Area
 - Athens Public Transit located between Hocking, Gallia, Vinton, and Washington
 - Athens On Demand provides door-to-door transportation service for county
 - Logan Public Transit passes through Hocking county from Logan



Why Athens?

- Multiple Other Nearby Areas with high youth homelessness rate
 - Vinton, Hocking, Gallia, Washington



- Easy Access to Public Transit in Surrounding Area

- Athens Public Transit located between Hocking, Gallia, Vinton, and Washington
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- Has a large substance abuse rate

- homeless have alcohol and/or drug problems

- have lifetime histories of drug
 - Potential cause of adolescent youth homelessness

Next Steps

- Surveying local residents in potential locations to gather their opinions as well as potentially garner any local support
- Research primary services needed in potential locations to allocate the resources necessary to better serve those communities
 - Also look into services already provided in Athens and see how Star House would either complement or contrast those services
- Construct a more interactive model to calculate the best potential locations
 - Cost-Benefit Analysis of Potential States/Counties
- Expand analysis on metric 3 to include Hockin, Gallio, Vinton, and Washington
